## **Overview**

Quran is the final word of God revealed to Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) for us to read, understand and practice as a guide in our daily lives. For a Muslim, Quran delivers its central message of firm belief in the oneness of God, inculcates the sense of accountability and gives glad tidings of a blissful reward of doing good in the most resounding ways. In order for Quran to act as a constant reminder of this basic message for us, it is incumbent upon every student of Islam to make an effort in understanding the Quran directly in the language in which it was revealed.

The language and style of Quran have no parallel. It uses fewer Arabic words in their different forms and styles in a very eloquent and impressive way. This course intends to first familiarize students with the most fundamental grammatical concepts of Arabic language and then go through the text of Quran and understand it through its vocabulary, forms and styles. Besides Quran, the course will also include some texts from hadith literature to reinforce grammatical and stylistic concepts of Arabic language.

The course is consisted of two main parts: Basic Arabic grammar and text from Quran and Hadith Literature.

## **Objectives:**

At the end of this course the students will be able to:

- Understand the fundamentals of the Arabic grammar.
- Read and comprehend the fundamental messages of the Quran directly in its own language
- Read and understand the meaning and message of the sayings of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) directly in its own language
- Take the guidance and inspiration directly from Quran and sayings of the Prophet

## **Delivery Method:**

Teaching methods used in this course will include lectures, storytelling, small projects/homework and class discussions on topics and situations.
